- 1. Easily accessible with transparent procedures
- 2. User-friendly format supported by most operating systems
- 3. Few steps to get to the clip, with a direct link whenever possible
- 4. Excellent quality audio without distortion, static, or other problems
- 5. Provides a written transcript to provide at the end for a final listening

Content

- 6. Interesting content to motivate participants to learn more and adapted to students' immediate needs
- 7. A wealth of user-friendly supplementary materials & good supporting activities
- 8. Makes use of the language & vocabulary that is part of instructor's theme-based unit
- 9. Uses the grammar and vocabulary students currently need: videos
- 10. Has a cultural component to add to students' cultural knowledge base
- 11. Level of material allows improvement of listening skills, not discouragement
- 12. Short length, below 4 minutes

- 13. Attention to triggering ideas for discussion and writing
